Biggest to Smallest Christmas Tree

This activity is to encourage your child to cut using correct grasp, write his/her first name using correct pencil grasp, putting objects in order from largest to smallest, and to name a variety of shapes. Please have your child cut out the triangles and put them in order from largest at the bottom to smallest at the top in order to create a Christmas tree. Then, you can use sequins, stickers, construction paper, etc... of different shapes to use as ornaments on your tree. Have your child name the shapes as he/she puts them on the tree. At the bottom of the paper, have your child write his/her name. Please return the activity and this completed sheet by December 13th, so we can hang it in the hallway for everyone to enjoy.
